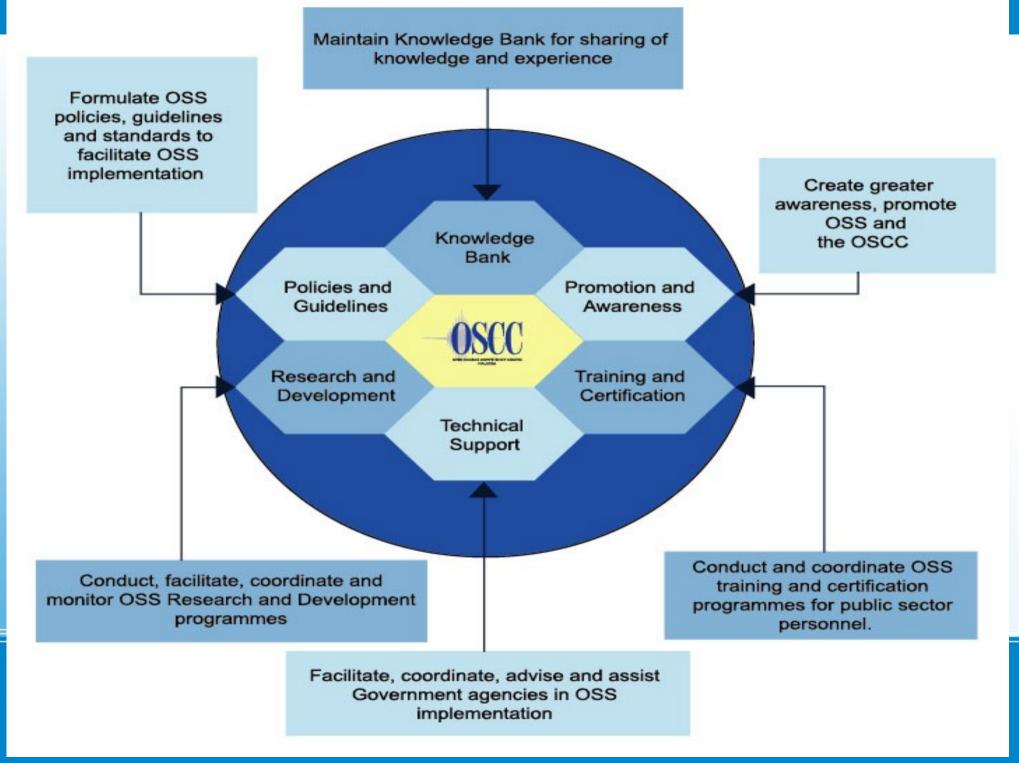


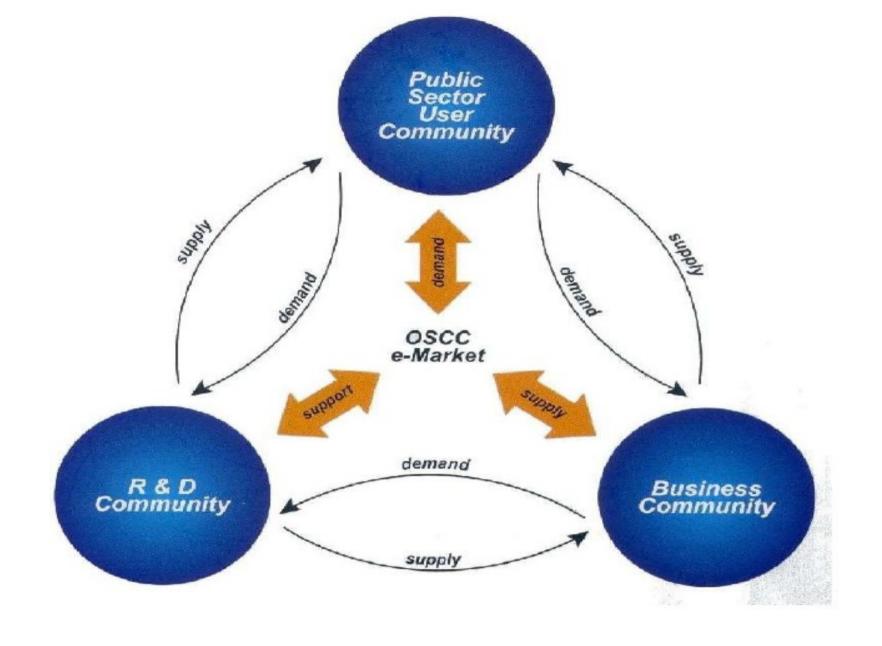

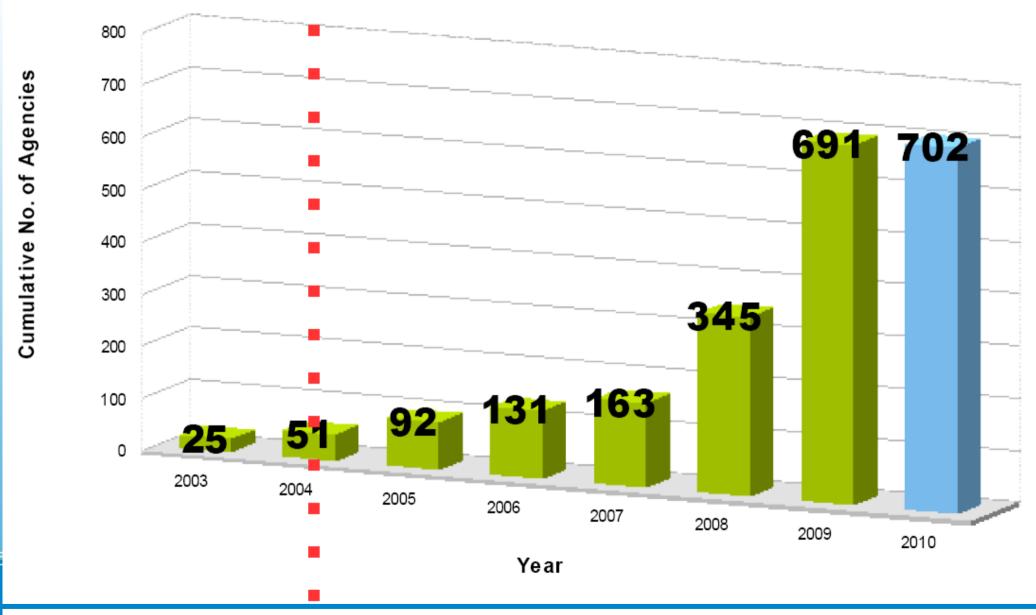

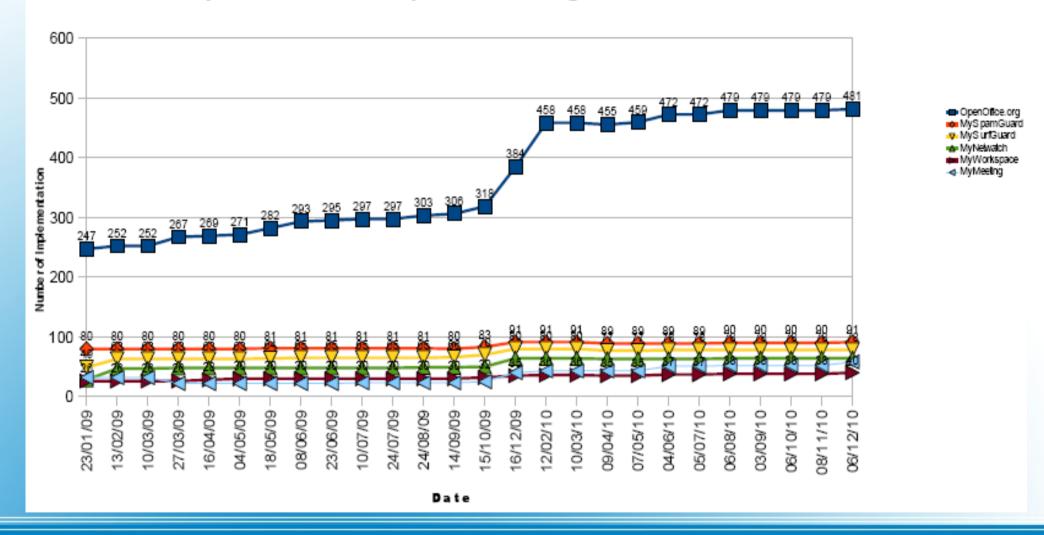

OSS Adoption Trend 06/12/10

 Since OSS does not impose license or royalty fees, unlike proprietary software, the OSS adoption and implementation in Government agencies has also resulted in an estimated known savings of RM 198 million to-date. These known savings that represent a mere tip of the iceberg could be channelled for other essential Government projects and activities such as improving infrastructure in rural areas and upgrading ICT facilities in agencies.

Cost-effective and connected government



OSCC MAMPU's promotional efforts, five state governments, namely Pahang, Sabah, Perak, Sarawak and Penang, have issued circulars to their respective state agencies to use the OSS-based productivity tool, OpenOffice.org., in all PC desktops.

OSS has been deployed in all 3 levels of Government, namely Federal (99.6%), State (94.9%) and

Municipalities (95.8%). At the Municipal level, OSS has also been used in the entire spectrum of the e-government

services such as e-Complaints, e-Submissions, e-Building, e-Planning and e-Licenses.


